



## Pupil Premium Impact Report (Financial year 2017-18)

### Overview of funding at Longstone School

Each ever 6 child received £1320.

Each 'looked after child' and 'post-adoption' child received £1900.

Based on our numbers in the January 2017 census, our pupil premium allocation for 2017-18 was £11,720.

During 2017-18, 6% of our pupils qualified for Pupil Premium (This equated to 8 children).

Our Pupil Premium was allocated in the form of:

- TA led booster sessions for Y6
- TA focused support sessions within class and in small groups
- Infant milk
- School uniform subsidies
- 1:1 reading intervention work
- Computer software
- Additional resources to enhance learning such as subsidised funding for trips
- Positive play to support children with emotional well-being issues
- Maintenance of school pets to increase attendance

### Impact of provision

- Analysis of data shows that pupil premium pupils are achieving broadly in line with non-pupil premium peers in reading, writing and maths.
- The gap between this group of children and their non-Pupil Premium peers is relatively small and in some year groups, Pupil Premium pupils are achieving better than non-Pupil Premium pupils.
- In Key Stage 100% of Pupil Premium pupils are attaining age related expectations or above in reading, writing and maths.
- The large majority of Pupil Premium children are making expected progress in reading; 100% in writing and 66% in maths.
- The attendance of a former pupil improved due to intervention funded by Pupil Premium spending.
